DIVING

Diving at Worthing is going from strength to strength and as a diving coach who is still 'learning the trade' it is very exciting. We are beginning to put together a very good squad with a lot of talented divers and proving to be the number one in Sussex.

This was substantiated by the results in the Sussex 1m competition where Polly Simon, who is still only 12, regained the title of the 1m girls and ladies for the third year in a row, not a bad achievement of somebody so young. In fact Worthing, who filled the first 3 places in both the girls and ladies events, dominated the female competition. Katie Hamilton, who has only been diving for 5 months, finished 2nd in both the girls and ladies events with Phillipa Warrington

finishing 3rd in both. Megan Warrington was 4th in the girls

and Charles Milner-Smith won the boys event and finished 2nd in the men's. Sam, Charles's brother, in his first Sussex event dived really well and finished 5th. In the previous month Katie entered her very first competition at Crystal Palace and won the Southern Counties Novice, which was an excellent achievement. Megan finished 12th in the same age group and Emma O'Shea, also her first competition, finished 15th in the younger age group. All of them dived brilliantly.

We have to build on these achievements. Polly and Katie will be entering the National Age Groups this year, which be held at Southampton. This will be the first time I have entered any divers into the Nationals.

The Club, as I have previously mentioned, is purchasing us a bubble machine, but we are in desperate need for new diving boards. The boards at the Aquarena are not up to competition standard and it is very unfair to expect our divers to train on these boards and then compete on ones that are far superior to ours. I am now actively seeking sponsors, not only to try and help fund some new diving boards, but also to help pay the expenses of the young divers. We are very fortunate in the respect that both

my sister and brother-in-law are Great Britain coaches who are prepared to help train our divers by letting us use their facilities. However, as their pool is in Luton it is still costing a lot of money to travel there as well as all the competitions in Leeds, Plymouth, and Sheffield. The diving parents, who are tremendously supportive towards me, are now racking their brains to try and come up with fund raising ideas. If anybody has any suggestions please let us know.

DISCIPLINE

The matter of Club members' behaviour has recently become a matter of concern. Some of you will be aware that one member has recently left the Club by mutual agreement following a particular incident. This incident has been accompanied by other occurrences of general hooliganism on the coach travelling to and from galas, in the changing rooms at galas and on Club training evenings. These incidents range from verbal harassment, misuse of equipment, interfering with property and clothing, lack of obedience, effort, attention and commitment during training sessions (resulting in disruption of lanes), minor bullying and other loutish foul behaviour.

Several complaints of varying degrees of seriousness have been made by parents and Aquarena staff. The frequency of these complaints is such that several members and their parents have already been spoken to about their behaviour. The other

members involved should be very conscious that the Club are well aware of who the repeat offenders are. It is not funny and suggests that the swimmers in question are not putting their full effort into their swimming and as a result have too much energy left at the end of the evening.

As a result of these events a Code of Conduct is to be introduced shortly and it will be mandatory that all members of the Club sign up to this Code (and their parents if under 16 years). Sanctions will be taken if infringement occurs, ranging from suspension from training sessions, competitions and ultimately from the Club.
