It proved a busy weekend for brother and sister Ben/Jodie Curtis who also made the journey to the Cranleigh open along with Eleanor Culverhouse. Swimmers claiming top three finishes and medals were

Ben Curtis(10) one silver, two bronze  
Jodie Curtis(11) one gold, one silver, one bronze

Well done the Curtis family on this haul of medals and placings. It just goes to show that dedication and perseverance in those so young can lead to success and worth while achievement.

Worthing swimmers again showed some decent form at the Southampton open meet on Sunday. In total eight Worthing Swimming Club records were broken

Harry Burnell(11) 100 Free and 50 Back  
Joe Hazeldine(13) 100 Free, 100 Back, 100 Breast and 200 IM  
Alexander Cranford(16) 200 IM

Joe Hazeldine broke club records for the 100 free and backstroke that have stood since 1998 for the 13 years age group. Joe, Karen Chan and Harry Burnell again posted ASA South East region qualifying times whilst Alexander Cranford gained a place in the "skins" final for his top eight 200IM finish.
