

HASLEMERE OPEN MEET REPORT

The Haslemere Open Meet was as last year a well organised meet. Everything seemed to run to plan.

Of those that entered all achieved a personal best time some more than others.

First place wins were achieved by Ben Curtis, Nicholas Savill, Ben Goddard and Michelle Hepworth. Outstanding consistent swimming from Charlie Hepworth, as he continues to knock on the door of being under a minute with his front crawl with another good time of 1.00.64 and in the 50m 27.53.

Elliott Moore was a late entry. Elliott had been taking some extra training before this event and it paid off with a good time in his 50m Free of 36.18 and he manage a silver medal in the Breaststroke 200m with a time of 3.29.95.

Michelle Hepworth achieved 5 personal bests swims on the day, slowly closing in on being under 1.10 .00 on her front crawl.

Jodie Curtis managed a good time in her 100m freestyle of 1.15.47, a sign of progress; also a Breaststroke time of 3.16.04 close on 7 seconds faster than her previous best time, well done Jodie.

Brother Ben Curtis managed a personal best time in the 100m Freestyle of 1.18.89.

Harleigh and Ben Goddard swam well with personal bests and medals for both. Ben showing all how good he can be in the water, often showing brute force to achieve good times.

Archy Burnell, Harry Burnell and Luke Moore managed to improve times in some events on the Saturday; most noticeable was the 50m Butterfly for Archy over a second quicker.

The outstanding swims on the day go without question to Nicholas Savill who starts his campaign off to a fantastic start for Regional Qualifying with personal best's swims in his Breaststroke. He did this by taking 13 seconds off his 200m time coming in at 2.57.15, and in the 100m took close on 8 seconds with a time of 1.21.44. He continued to smash entry times with his Individual Medley time with another 4 seconds plus with a time of 1.15.50.
